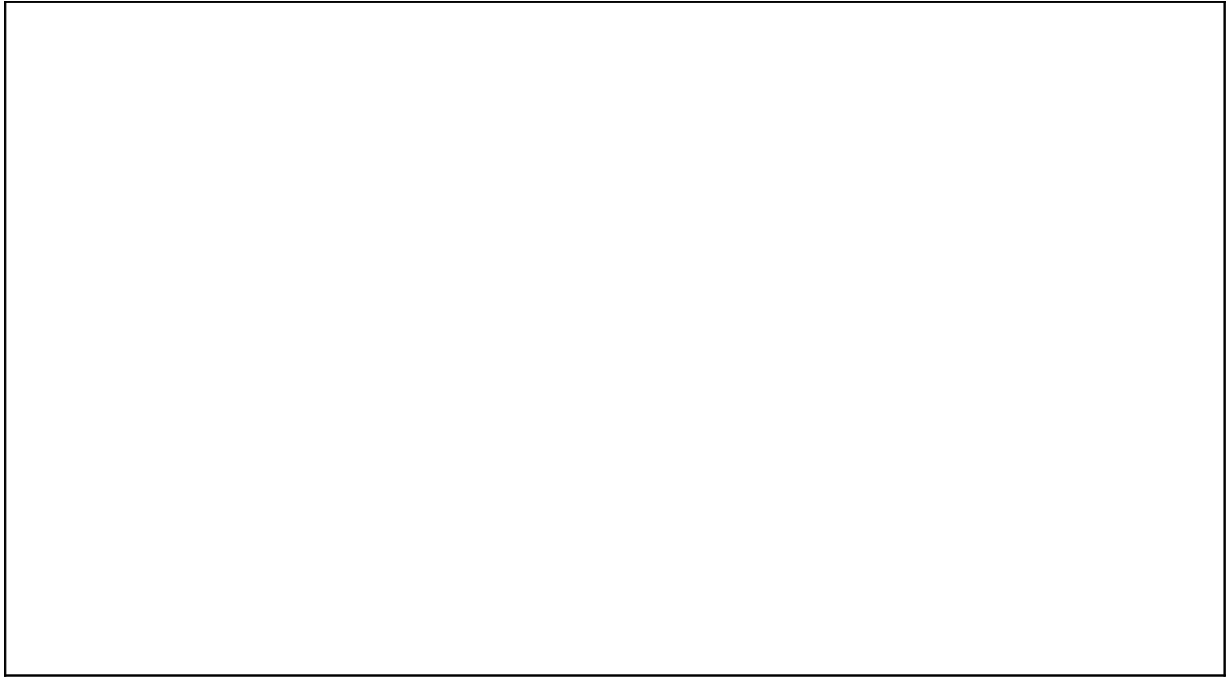

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>ISSUE / TOPIC</u></p> <p>We note that the “Coastal Management's” three-monthly updates still list our bay in the “poor” category. As we no longer receive the City's water quality reports, we'd like confirmation that the City's Andrew Taylor's relining of the sewage pipes in Fish Hoek's Lighthouse catchment basin and / or the removal of containers from Bayside Bazaar had the desired impact of lowering the E. coli and Enterococcus results from the water sample analysis performed by the City's Scientific Services Department.</p> <p>We request the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to have, at least, sight (or preferably a copy) of the City of Cape Town's Coastal Pollution Monitoring – False Bay Coast & Atlantic Coast and Urban Run-off and inland water bodies reports prepared for the City of Cape Town's Water & Waste Directorate from 25 March 2020 to date; • the dates for Mr Taylor's relining; and • the dates for the removal of containers from Bayside Bazaar. <p>If no one else receives these reports, we think that at least Andrew Taylor should receive them in order to do his job effectively.</p>
